Our Nursery is located at Thomasville, Ga., near the city limits and visitors are accorded a hearty welcome any day in the week.

TERMS

Cash or 20 per cent with order and balance when trees are ordered out.

STOCK ON HAND

The varieties named in this list represents the stock that we have on hand, the quotations are made subject to prior sale. It is, therefore, best to make a second choice in your order. Orders are accepted subject to unavoidable injury to stock.

CLAIMS

All claims shall be made within five days after receipt of trees.

WHEN TO PLANT

Trees may be set from November 15th to March 31st, and our trees having a good root system, live well when properly handled. We do not guarantee trees to live. The roots should not be exposed to the sun or air, but should be kept well wrapped until hole is ready to receive them.

VARIETIES

Frotcher.—Large, thin shelled and easily cracked. Heavy bearer; flavor good. A handsome grower. A very fine nut.

Stuart.—Large to very large, fills well, shell medium, quality good. It grows over a large area and is well known commercially. Very prolific and popular wherever known. One of the most reliable.

Schley.—Oblong, very thin shell, medium to large in size. Extra good flavor. Trees are symmetrical and handsome. Fairly prolific. Fills well, Popular and well known. Nuts bring the highest prices.

Money Maker.—Medium size, heavy bearer, fine quality. This nut is coming rapidly into popularity since its good qualities have become known.

Success.—Large, to very large, shell moderately thin and kernel usually plump. flavor very good. Tree is a good grower, but has not been introduced in some sections.

Teche.—Medium size with thin shell and very prolific bearer. It is usually a heavy bearer and popular among those who have them. Nuts similar to Frotcher, but some smaller.

DIRECTIONS FOR PLANTING

The hole should be dug about 2 1-2 feet wide and three feet deep. The tree should be set in the ground fully as deep as it grew in the nursery and the ground level and should be slightly below the surrounding surface so that water will accumulate around the tree, but this depression should never be allowed to settle enough to expose any part of the roots or tree that was originally under ground. Place the top soil in the hole first, and top soil is also better than clay on the top. Press the dirt firmly about the roots as it is put in the hole, being careful not to bruise the roots in tramping. Do not let the trees lie out in the sun or air, but unpack them only when you are ready to plant them. Wet the packed roots, or keep wet sack over them until planted.
